CONTEST GUIDELINES

Black History Dramatic Reading Contest

A Celebration of Black History Month

Sponsored by the Josephine School Community Museum –

Clarke County African American Cultural Center

- Contest is open to students in grades 2, 3, 4 and 5
- Reading selections must be taken from a published work of fiction, poetry, folklore, history or biography written by or about African-Americans. Excerpts may be used.

Reading selections should be timed as follows:

Grade 2 Not less than **1** minute nor more than **3** minutes

Grade 3 Not less than **1** minute nor more than **3** minutes

Grades 4&5 Not less than **2** minutes nor more than **4** minutes

Readers will introduce themselves to the audience:

Give name, school and grade

Give title of reading selection

Readers will be judged on the following criteria:

1. Choice of selection (20 points)
 - Selection is age appropriate
 - Meets criteria mentioned above
 - Meets time requirements
2. Interpretation (60 points)
 - Enunciates and pronounce words clearly
 - Reads with expression
 - Reads from the text (not memorized)
 - Helps audience enjoy and understand literary work
3. General stage presence (20 points)
 - Neat appearance
 - Stands with good posture
 - Makes eye contact with audience

Judges will be community members with an interest in education, leadership and literature.

Prizes will be awarded for the best readers in each grade level. Every participant will receive a certificate.
